

ORDER

Considering the need to approve internal regulations with a view to applying, in the Polytechnic Institute of Tomar (IPT), the provisions of Decree-Law no.36/2014 dated 10 March on entrance requirements for international students in all courses of study offered by its schools and respective application procedures through a special entrance scheme for international students provided in the abovementioned decree-law;

Considering that, under sub-paragraph (o) of article 92 of Law no.62/2007 dated 10 September and sub-paragraph (n) of paragraph (1) of article 43 of IPT's statutes approved by Regulatory Order No.17/2009 of 30 April, it is the IPT President's responsibility to approve the regulations set forth in the law and the statutes;

On consultation with the Scientific and Pedagogical councils of the Schools attached to the Polytechnic Institute of Tomar;

Under the provisions of article 14 of Law No.36/2014 of 10 March and the abovementioned legal and statutory rules

I determine that:

1. The Regulations for the Implementation of the Legal Scheme for Recruiting International Students in the Polytechnic Institute of Tomar set forth by article 14 of Decree-Law no.36/2014 of 10 March, appended to this document, are approved.
2. For all legal purposes, the text referred to in the previous paragraph shall be an integral part of the present document.
3. The present regulations shall take effect on the day after its date of publication.

ANNEX

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE LEGAL SCHEME FOR RECRUITING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS TO THE POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTE OF TOMAR

CHAPTER I

General Provisions

Article 1

Concept and Scope

1 - The present regulations establish, within the Polytechnic Institute of Tomar (IPT) and its Schools, the application of the legal scheme for recruiting international students set out in Decree-Law no.36/2014 of 10 March for the purpose of entering Bologna first cycle degree programmes (*licenciatura*).

2 - For the purposes set forth in the previous paragraph, by "international student" is meant every student whose nationality is not Portuguese, except if:

- a) He/she is a citizen of a EU member state;
- b) Although not a citizen of a EU member state, he/she has been living in Portugal for more than two years on a continual basis as on August 31 of the year in which he/she intends to attend the IPT as well as his/her co-habiting children;
- c) Apply for entry via the special entrance schemes regulated by Decree-Law no.393-A/99 of 2 October as amended by Decree-Law no.272/2009 of October 1.

3 - The provisions of the previous paragraph also do not apply to foreign students who are attending programmes of study at the IPT under the framework of an international mobility programme in order to carry out part of their degree studies started at a foreign higher education institution with which IPT has signed an agreement.

4 - The duration of the residence permit for study purposes is not relevant to the purposes of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 2.

5 - Students accessing the Portuguese higher education system under Decree-law no.36/2014 of 10 March shall maintain the "international student" status until the completion of the course of study they have applied for or which they transfer to,

regardless of whether their first enrolment was at the IPT or at another Portuguese higher education establishment.

6 - The provisions of the previous paragraph do not apply to international students who become citizens of a EU member state.

7 - Termination of application of the "international student" status as a result of the provisions of the previous paragraph takes effect in the academic year subsequent to the date of acquisition of the nationality.

CHAPTER II

Admission and Entrance Conditions and Requirements

Article 2

Special Admission and Entrance Scheme for International Students

Admission and entrance of international students to first-cycle degree programmes (*licenciatura*) offered by IPT shall be undertaken solely through the special admission and entrance scheme regulated by Decree-law no. 36/2014 of 10 March and the present regulations.

Article 3

Admission Requirements

1 - The following individuals are eligible to apply to first-cycle degree programmes offered by IPT:

- a) Holders of a qualification that confers on them the right to apply and be admitted to a higher education establishment of the country that awarded the qualification;
- b) Holders of a Portuguese Secondary School Diploma or equivalent qualification;

2 - Validation of the qualification holder status referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 1 shall be performed by the competent authority of the country awarding the qualification.

3 - The equivalence mentioned in 1(b) is defined by Decree no.224/2006 dated 8 March and Decree no.699/2006 dated 12 July approving the comparative tables between the Portuguese education system and other education systems as well as the conversion

tables from the corresponding countries under the terms of article 5(a) of Decree-Law no.227/2005 of 28 December.

Article 4

Entrance Requirements

1 - In order to be admitted to a degree programme through the special admission and entrance scheme for international student applicants must meet all the following requirements:

- a) Holding academic qualifications in the subject fields required for the degree programme they are applying for as specified in Annex I or II and under the terms of article 5;
- b) Having the level of Portuguese language proficiency required to attend the programme of study in question or undertaking to achieve it at the IPT prior to commencement of the academic year in question in accordance with the provisions of article 6;

2 - Compliance with the conditions set out in the previous paragraph shall be verified under the terms of the subsequent articles.

Article 5

Verification of Academic Qualifications

1 - Applicants must demonstrate appropriate knowledge of the subject matters of the exams specified in Annexes I and II.

2 - Where an applicant holds a Portuguese Secondary Education Diploma, the grade point average of entrance exams shall be used in accordance with the weighting specified in Annex I.

3 - Where an applicant holds a diploma from the foreign education systems listed in annex II, the grade point average to be used shall be that obtained in the foreign exams after conversion to the 0-200 scale, as applicable. Conversion to the 0-200 scale shall comply with the following formula:

$$Y = 200 \times (X - X_{\min}) / (X_{\max} - X_{\min})$$

Where:

Y = applicant's grade point average in the 0-200 scale (Portuguese scale)

X = applicant's grade point average in the applicant's home country

X_{\min} = minimum grade point average in home country

X_{\max} = maximum grade point average in home country

4 - Where applicants hold foreign qualifications equivalent to the Portuguese secondary school diploma as provided by article 3 paragraph 2, entrance exams set out in paragraph 2 may be replaced by final exams of units/modules of those qualifications under the specified terms and according to the provisions of article 20-A of Decree-law no.296-A/98 dated 25 September, in its current wording, defining the general HE access scheme as well as according to any decree which might be approved in the future for any academic year by the National Committee for Admission to Higher Education.

5 - In all the remaining situations, applicants shall sit for Portuguese nationwide entrance exams as an individual applicant or take the equivalent exams held by IPT for the programme of study they are applying for, with the admission grade being calculated according to the weighting described in Annex I.

6 - The Portuguese entrance exams mentioned in the previous paragraph shall be held in Portugal or in a Portuguese school abroad and applicants must comply with the application terms and legal deadlines advertised by the Portuguese Directorate-General for Higher Education (DGES).

7 - The procedures used for the exams equivalent to the nationwide entrance exams offered by IPT, mentioned in paragraph 5, are established by order of the IPT President, with the exam schedule and respective terms being advertised as provided by article 7, paragraph 5.

8 - Performance of Portuguese equivalent exams mentioned in paragraph 5 implies the payment of a separate fee specified in the IPT's Fee Schedule.

9 – Grade point averages from entrance exams or equivalents to be considered in applications are those obtained in the calendar year or the three calendar years prior to application.

10 - Where expressed in a different scale, application grade point averages shall be converted to the 0-200 scale in accordance with Annex III or, where it does not apply, with the general conversion rules.

11 - The minimum application grade point average for each course of study is 100 and the minimum average for each entrance exam or equivalent exam is 95 after conversion to the 0-200 scale, if applicable.

12 - The annexes mentioned in the previous paragraphs shall be approved and reviewed annually by order of the IPT President and advertised on the IPT's website up to 3 months before the application deadline to the special admission and entrance scheme for international students.

Article 6

Verification of language proficiency

1 - Attendance of any first-cycle degree programme offered by IPT requires a command of the Portuguese language as an independent user (level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).

2 - International applicants holding an intermediate level of proficiency in Portuguese (level B1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) may apply under the framework of this entrance scheme as long as they undertake to attend a one-year course in Portuguese Language in accordance with paragraph 5 of this article.

3 - The previous provisions do not apply to the students who have attended the Portuguese secondary education without prejudice to the provisions of paragraph 7.

4 - Except for those who have attended the Portuguese secondary education, applicants must:

- a) Declare in writing and on oath that they are independent users of Portuguese (B1 level) or higher;
- b) Provide an Elementary Diploma of Portuguese as a Foreign Language (DEPLE) or a B1 certificate from a Portuguese institution authorised to issue it or sit for a Portuguese language exam held by IPT. This exam is subject to a fee according to IPT's Fee Schedule and the dates are advertised every year.

5 - International students who have not attended the Portuguese secondary education and do not prove holding a DIPLE level B2 or a B2 certificate from a Portuguese institution authorised to issue it must undertake to attend a one-year Portuguese language course:

- a) That course is taught at the IPT Language Centre and has additional costs;

- b) The language course and the degree programme the student applied for may be attended simultaneously;
- c) At the end of the academic year, the Language Centre shall inform the academic services of whether or not the student has achieved the B2 level.

6 - Unsuccessful students are required to re-enrol in the language course until they achieve the B2 level.

7 - Attendance to the B2 level course may be compulsory for students who, although having attended the Portuguese secondary education, have a level of proficiency inferior to B2 as follows:

- a) Recommendation on the attendance to this course should be made by the degree programme coordinator, even though that need may have been detected by another lecturer;
- b) Students may request a diagnostic test before enrolling in the language course and shall be exempted from attending it if they achieve level B2;
- c) The diagnostic test mentioned in the previous paragraph is subject to a fee.

CHAPTER III

Applications

Article 7

Admission quotas and deadlines

1 - The admission quotas for each course of study are established on a yearly basis by the IPT President until at least 3 months before the application date, after consultation with the School Directors.

2 - When establishing admission quotas the following should be taken into account:

- a) The admission quotas established in the programme accreditation process;
- b) The human and material resources allocated to the School offering the degree programme in question;
- c) The admission quotas established for the general admission scheme and for the remaining admission schemes;

- d) The limits previously established by order of the member of government with competence on higher education matters;
- e) Any general guidelines previously established by the member of government with competence on higher education matters;

3 - The admission quotas mentioned in paragraph 1 shall be communicated to the DGES on an annual basis accompanied by the respective reasoning.

4 - The special admission scheme for international students runs within a time schedule determined annually by the IPT President until at least 3 months before the application date as follows:

- a) The time schedule shall be advertised on the IPT's website;
- b) There may be more than one application phase.

5 - Every year, the IPT president shall stipulate dates for the performance of the exams equivalent to Portuguese entrance exams mentioned in paragraph 4 of article 5 which should be compatible with the deadlines of the special admission and entrance scheme for international students.

Article 8

Application Procedure

1 - Students apply using an appropriate form, which may be submitted in paper format or via an online platform available from IPT website, indicating the name of the school and the degree programme they wish to apply for.

2 - When submitted in paper format, the application request must be submitted to the Registry Office (Direcção dos Serviços Académicos) of the IPT by the student, a representative or an individual who proves to be a parent or tutor of the student if he/she is a minor.

3 - Application requests may also be submitted through any competent international authority from the student's home country provided that details are agreed and arranged between IPT and the abovementioned authority.

4 – Application requests are subject to the payment of a fee set out in IPT's fee schedule.

Article 9 **Application documentation**

1 - The application process must be accompanied by the following documents:

- a) Copy of ID card or other legal identification document issued by the home-country authorities;
- b) Declaration of oath attesting that the applicant does not have Portuguese citizenship and is not subject to any of the terms listed in paragraph 2 of article 1 or, for cases provided for by article 18, that he/she opts for the international student status under the terms of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 2 of the abovementioned article in accordance with a form template available from the Registry Office and the IPT website;
- c) Document attesting completion of the Portuguese secondary education or equivalent, if applicable;
- d) If the academic qualification presented is not listed in annexes I or II, the student must provide documentary evidence from the awarding country duly validated by the competent authority of that country under the terms of article 3, paragraph 2.
- e) Documentary evidence of the grade point average obtained:
 - i) In the final exams for Portuguese secondary education corresponding to entrance exams for holders of a Portuguese secondary education diploma or for holders of a foreign secondary education diploma who took those exams as individual applicants;
 - ii) In the nationwide higher education entrance exam in the situations stated in article 5, paragraph 3;
 - iii) In the final exams of courses/modules within foreign courses of study equivalent to the Portuguese secondary education which may, in the cases set out in article 5(4), replace entrance exams;
 - iv) Where applicants are unable to provide the document mentioned in the previous sub-paragraph they shall provide a statement signed on oath of the grades obtained and the necessary documentary evidence until the end of the third month following registration and enrolment;
- f) Elementary Diploma of Portuguese as a Foreign Language (DEPLE) or Intermediate Diploma of Portuguese as a Foreign Language (DIPLLE) or B1 or B2 certificates from a Portuguese institution authorised to issue them or a

statement signed on oath attesting that applicants have a command of the Portuguese language corresponding to level B1 where they have not attended the Portuguese secondary education;

g) Power of Attorney where application request is submitted by a representative.

2 - The documents mentioned in sub-paragraphs (c), (d), (e), and (g) must be translated if they are not issued in Portuguese, English, French or Spanish and certified by the consular authorities or endorsed with the Hague Apostille by the competent authority of the state issuing it.

3 - For applications on paper format, the documents mentioned in previous paragraphs must accompany the application request.

4 - For applications submitted through the online platform available from the IPT's website, the documents mentioned in the previous paragraph shall be sent, within 3 working days after submission of application, by registered and recorded mail to the following address:

Article 10

Evaluation and Selection of Applications

Evaluation and selection of applications is the responsibility of an Evaluation and Selection Committee appointed by the IPT President and composed by at least three members appointed among IPT's tenured lecturers, middle or senior managers, one of which chairs with one casting vote.

Article 11

Selection Criteria

1 - Selection is sorted in descending order of the grade point averages.

2 - The grade point average corresponds to the sum of all grades obtained multiplied by their weighting factors as described in Annexes I and II.

3 - Considering that there are several scales, all grades must be expressed in the 0-200 scale converted under the terms of Annex III.

4 - In the event of a tie and where two or more applicants dispute the last place, additional vacancies shall be created.

Article 12

Inadmissible Requests

1 - The requests that fall within one of the following circumstances shall be held inadmissible:

- a) They are not accompanied by the necessary documentation;
- b) They do not comply with Decree-Law no.36/2014 of 10 March and the present regulations;
- c) The fee mentioned in paragraph 4 of article 8 has not been paid.

2 - The decision to dismiss requests as inadmissible must always be reasoned.

Article 13

Exclusion of Applicants

1 - The international students who, at any stage of the process whatsoever, have made false statements or have submitted documents in a demonstrably fraudulent manner.

2 – The IPT President is responsible for any decisions concerning exclusion of applicants, which must be duly substantiated and subject to prior consultation with the people concerned.

Article 14

Dissemination of results

1 - The final results are advertised on IPT website and posted on the usual notice boards in the Schools.

2 - Mention to inadmissible applications or rejection for lack of sufficient vacancies must be accompanied by mention of the appropriate reasoning.

3 - International students may appeal against an admission decision to the Evaluation and Selection Committee within the deadline specified in the time schedule set out for the procedure.

Article 15

Registration and Enrolment

- 1 - The admitted students shall register and enrol within the stipulated dates.
- 2 - The IPT shall not issue document certifying registration and enrolment required for obtaining a visa until international students are registered and enrolled.
- 3 - International students shall provide the originals of the documents submitted with application within three calendar months after registration and enrolment.
- 4 - If the contents of the documents mentioned in the previous paragraph differ from those submitted in the application, the IPT reserves the right to re-evaluate the application in question and reject it, under the terms of article 13, if the applicant does not meet the requirements specified in applicable regulations.
- 5 - Failure to submit the original documents and to make proof of self-proclaimed facts upon application, failure to meet the pre-requisites, if applicable, and the special requisites subject to scrutiny in local application procedures shall result in cancellation of registration and enrolment.
- 6 - If a student does not enrol within the deadline the following student in the list shall take his/her place in compliance with the selection criteria until the vacancy is filled or until all applicants to the programme in question are exhausted.

Article 16

Tuition Fee

- 1 - Tuition Fee and other fees for international students are established by the statutorily appointed bodies.
- 2 - Registration and enrolment are not valid until the first tuition fee - which represents 40% of the total annual fee - is paid.
- 3 - International students are subject to the same fee-payment scheme that applies to home students for the course of study in question, i.e. the remaining amount of the annual fee may be paid by instalments without prejudice to the provisions of the subsequent paragraph.

4 - In the event of withdrawal or cancellation of registration the amount already paid by the international student towards tuition fee shall not be refund, either totally or in part.

CHAPTER IV

Miscellaneous Provisions

Article 17

Applicable regime

With the exception of the legal regime applicable to international students and the present regulations, international students admitted in IPT are subject to the same rules applicable to IPT resident students, including in matters related with the accreditation of prior academic or experiential learning.

Article 18

Students with more than one nationality

1 - The international students who, at the time of application, also hold Portuguese citizenship or are citizens of a EU member state where they maintain a regular address will not be able to apply.

2 - Where applicants hold one or more foreign nationalities of which one is from a EU member state where they maintain a regular address, they may at the time of application choose the preferred status as follows:

- a) If they choose the international student status which enables them to apply under the framework of the special entrance scheme, they will have to keep it until the end of the period of studies they applied for;
- b) If they choose the national student status, they will not be able to apply under the framework of the special entrance scheme for international students.

Article 19

Re-admission and transfer processes

The decree governing the international student status and the present regulations, particularly article 16, apply to international students admitted as from 2014/2015 via re-admission and transfer schemes.

CHAPTER V
Final and transitory provisions

Article 20
Information

The IPT shall provide the Directorate-General for Higher Education, within the stipulated time limits, with information concerning students admitted and enrolled under the framework of the special entrance scheme for international students.

Article 21
Inconsistencies and omissions

Any inconsistencies and omissions arising from the application of the present regulations shall be resolved by an order of the IPT President on consultation with the Evaluation and Selection Committee on matters within their sphere of competence.

Article 22
Transitory Provisions

1 - For the 2014-2015 application the deadlines mentioned in article 7 shall be set at least one month before the application start date.

2 - The provisions of article 16 do not apply to international students enrolled in the academic year 2013-2014 until the period of studies they applied for is completed.

Article 23
Final Provisions

1 - The list describing foreign education systems contained in Annex II may, at any occasion, be modified by an order of the IPT President.

2 - Unless otherwise provided in these regulations, all other IPT regulations shall apply.

Article 24
Entry into force

These regulations shall take effect from the day following that of its publication in the Portuguese Official Journal.
