# **Before Your Arrival**

#### Visa

#### **EU CITIZENS**

If you are a student from a Member State of the European Union (EU) you must have a valid ID card when travelling to Portugal.

#### **NON-EU CITIZENS**

If you are a non-EU citizen you must obtain a study visa from the Portuguese Embassy/Consulate located in your home country. In order to ensure you get a student visa you need an acceptance letter from IPT. You will receive it after we received your application in order.

#### Insurance

#### **EU CITIZENS**

If you are from EU countries you must obtain the European Health Insurance Card in your home country before you travel to Portugal. The European Health Insurance Card gives access to our National Health Service.

#### **NON-EU CITIZENS**

If you are a student from a non-European country you must obtain a valid private health insurance. Non-EU citizens coming from a country with whom Portugal has signed an international convention on health and social security must carry the documents which will allow them to access the Portuguese public health system (e.g. the PB4 Form for Brazil).

### Accommodation

Our halls of residence have double and triple rooms with access to a common kitchen and a living room. The rooms are fully furnished and equipped with bed linen and duvet, hand and bath towels. Linen towels are changed weekly. The common spaces are cleaned daily but the rooms should be cleaned by the students themselves. The kitchen is equipped with a cooker, a fridge and a microwave but without cutlery, crockery or cooking utensils. Regulations may be consulted HERE.

# **IPT Halls of Residence**

The Polytechnic offers accommodation in Halls of Residence. Students must fill in the accommodation application form but admission is not guaranteed since places are not enough for all applicants. Admission results are given out in September and February every year.

# Registration

### **Mobility program:**

If you are coming to IPT within a mobility program, you should visit the International Relations Office where you will receive all the information you need about registration, accommodations in our residence halls, student card, timetables, access to meals in our canteen, internet, library.

# Full course program:

If your are coming to IPT to study a full course as an international student, you should visit the Student Point of Contact (building A).

# **Resident Permit**

International students should get their Resident Permit within 90 days. You may find the necessary documents and apply through the AIMA website <a href="https://www.aima.gov.pt/pt">www.aima.gov.pt/pt</a>.

#### **VAT Number**

If you want to open a bank account in Portugal you will need to first get your VAT number (a fiscal number, NIF in Portugal). It serves to identify a body or a person when requested by the taxation authorities. The NIF is acquired for free and generated immediatly at the time of the request.

For that you must go to the tax office (Repartição de Finanças) in the city centreTo open a bank account, obtain a VAT number (NIF) at the tax office.

# Tomar, Abrantes, & Mação

#### **About Tomar**

Tomar is a medium-sized city located in central Portugal on the banks of the River Nabão. For this reason, its inhabitants are known as Nabantinos. The municipality of Tomar is made up of 16 towns, has an area of around 352 km² and 43,000 inhabitants and is located in the district of Santarém, in the province of Ribatejo. It is a natural area of great heritage and tourist value and also includes the Castelo de Bode reservoir. The city is crossed by the River Nabão, a tributary of the River Zêzere, which in turn flows into the River Tagus, the largest river in the Iberian Peninsula. The town is located in the northern part of Portugal's most fertile region, which is considered one of the most fertile on the Iberian Peninsula. Throughout the city you can find many houses with Renaissance, Baroque and Romantic façades. Next to the River Nabão is the Jardim do Mouchão. This garden offers a privileged view of the city and its surroundings.

The city was founded in the 12th century. In 1147, King Afonso Henriques conquered it from the Moors. Moors and in 1159 it was donated to the Knights Templar. Tomar was founded by D. Gualdim Pais in 1160. The Grand Master of the Order built the first stone of the Castle and Convent, which later became the headquarters of the Order in Portugal.

Human settlement (over 30,000 years ago) was due to the excellent climate, abundant water, easy river communication and excellent soils. From Tomar, the Knights Templar managed a vast region of central Portugal that they had undertaken to defend. Tomar played an especially important role in the 15th century, being at the center of the planning of the Portuguese discoveries, planned by Prince Henry the Navigator, Grand Master of the Order of Christ, the successor organization to the Order of the Knights Templar in Portugal. Today, the Convent of Christ is one of the country's most notable monuments, having been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983.

## **About Abrantes**

Tomar Abrantes is located in the center of major road and rail access, namely on the axis of the Lisbon/Porto freeway, the A23 and the Beira Baixa line. The municipality covers an area of around 713.46 km² and has a population of 42,436 inhabitants, spread over its 19 parishes. From the point of view of natural resources, Abrantes enjoys two of the largest water resources in the country: the River Tagus (which runs through the municipality for about 30 km) and the Castelo do Bode reservoir. It is a city of services, but also one with a strong industrial vocation and tradition that is increasingly asserting its strategic position in the region. Abrantes was founded in the mid-12th century as a result of the need to defend conquered territories and to ensure the active life of Santarém.

In order to better safeguard this defense, King Afonso Henriques donated his castle and the surrounding area to the Order of S. Tiago de Espada in 1173 and six years later granted it a charter (1179). In 1385, King João I was in Abrantes from where he went to the Battle of Aljubarrota. On June 13, 1476, the Lineage of the Counts of Almeida began, when D. Lopo de Almeida, father of the 1st Viceroy of India, was appointed 1st Count of Abrantes. In 1506 and 1507, Infantes D. Luís and D. Fernando (sons of King Manuel I) were born in Abrantes, in the old Royal Palace.







# The town of Mação

The municipality of Mação is located on the right bank of the River Tagus, on the border between Alto Ribatejo and Beiras, in a land of transition, marked by diversity and questioning. Mação is a Portuguese town in the district of Santarém, in the central region and sub-region of Médio Tejo, with around 2,200 inhabitants. It is the seat of a municipality with an area of 400.83 km<sup>2</sup> and 7,338 inhabitants, subdivided into 8 parishes.

The calm and rich waters of the Tagus and the Ribeira de Eiras over the Belver Dam in Ortiga make it a water sports paradise. Its landscape varies between the beauty of the mountains with waterfalls that end in small, welcoming natural pools, cliffs set in the massive crust of the mountains, like medieval castles, benefiting from all the purity of a mountain air and the refreshing charm of the huge reservoirs where everything is possible and desirable, with water as far as the eye can see - Belver Dam and Pracana Dam.

#### How to arrive

To travel from Lisbon to the Instituto Politécnico de Tomar (IPT) campus in Tomar, abrantes, or Mação, you can take a direct train from the Lisbon-Oriente railway station to any of the destinations. The journey typically lasts about 2h45 – 3h00, offering a scenic route through central Portugal. Upon arrival at the local station you may follow the following:

#### **Tomar**

Tomar is the last station and you may get there by bus or train. There are hourly trains to Tomar and few buses per day. Both journeys take around 2 hours and they are direct. In Tomar the bus and the train station are near each other and the IPT campus is around 10 minutes taxi drive. You may also get on the local TUTOMAR (info here).

#### **Abrantes**

You may reach Abrantes by bus or train, however, the station are not in the same location and the train station is considerably far from the city center. If you arrive late, you need a taxi. On the other hand, the bus station in Abrantes is much closer to the city center.

# Mação

Here you should buy a ticket for "Alvega/Ortiga" (you should remember this name as there are no direct trains to Mação), a station located about 5 km from Mação. There are usually several trains a day to Mação. The train journey to Mação takes about 2 hours. When you arrive at Alvega/Ortiga station, you should take a cab.

## Health care support structure

Both towns have health centers where students can register to access the National Health Services (SNS). These centers provide primary healthcare services, including general consultations, vaccinations, and basic medical care. The main health center in Tomar, located on Rua Nabância, is open from Monday to Friday, 9:00am to 12:00pm and 2:00pm to 5:30pm. For more specialized medical needs, the Hospital de Tomar, part of the Centro Hospitalar do Médio Tejo, offers comprehensive services including emergency care, specialized consultations, and inpatient facilities.

Similarly, in Abrantes, the local health center offers primary care, while the Hospital de Abrantes provides a wide range of medical services and emergency care. These healthcare facilities ensure that students at the Instituto Politécnico de Tomar have access to necessary medical support throughout their studies.
